### Pointers This Week:

After rallying from opening round losses in both the conference and regional tournaments, UW-Stevens Point makes its first appearance at the NCAA Division III baseball finals since 1997. The Pointers will take on traditional Division III power Marietta (Ohio) in the first round on Friday. The tournament is a double-elimination format with the finals set for Tuesday.

### Head Coach Pat Bloom:

UW-Stevens Point coach Pat Bloom carries a 97-43 record in his third season with the Pointers. Bloom participated in the World Series as a player with the 1997 Carthage squad that beat the Pointers 12-1 in the second round. He later transferred to UW-Stevens Point and is a 2001 graduate of the school. Bloom owns a Master's Degree in Sports Sciences from Miami (Ohio).

### Broadcast:

All games involving UW-Stevens Point will be carried live on WSPT (1010 AM) with Scott Krueger calling the play-by-play.

## Scouting the Opponents

**Marietta** is making its record 18th World Series appearance, surpassing UW-Oshkosh on the all-time list. The Pioneers won national titles in 1981, 1983 and 1986 - all coming on their home field. Marietta overcame Ohio Athletic Conference rival Otterbein 8-7 in 11 innings in the regional title game for just its second win in seven meetings this season. The Pioneers were runners-up to Otterbein in both the regular season and conference tournament. Junior pitcher Mike Eisenberg is 11-2 with a 1.36 ERA and has 115 strikeouts in 99 innings, while senior Jarrod Klausman is hitting a team-high .435.

**Aurora** beat Millsaps (Miss.) twice on the final day of the regional to advance to its sixth World Series. The Spartans, who placed third in 2004, are led by senior Aaron Thor with a .429 average, 10 home runs and 59 RBI's. Senior Alex Chapple is 8-1 with a 3.05 ERA and threw back-to-back no-hitters earlier this season.

**Montclair State** battled back from a first round loss to win six straight games in the regional, including two victories over top-ranked College of New Jersey in the title round. The Red Hawks, who are in their 13th World Series and have won three national titles, defeated UW-La Crosse 13-11 earlier this season. Brian Butler is the top hitter with a .354 average and 46 RBI's.

**Chapman** has one of the country's top pitching staffs led by junior Devin Drag, who is 9-1 with eight saves and a 0.80 ERA. Senior Buddy Klovstad is 12-1 with a 2.48 ERA. Senior Brian Brubaker is hitting .423 with 35 RBI's. The Panthers, who won the 2003 national title, beat first round opponent Eastern Connecticut State 5-3 on March 24.

**Eastern Connecticut State** had a similar road as UW-Stevens Point, winning nine times when faced with elimination. The Warriors, who are making their 11th trip to the World Series, have won four national titles under legendary coach Bill Holowaty, who ranks second in Division III history with 1,178 wins. Eastern Connecticut State is led by Shawn Gilblair with an 8-1 record and 1.43 ERA.

**North Carolina Wesleyan** had 28 days off prior to the regional, but showed no ill effects, holding opponents to 17 runs over five games. Luke Williford is hitting .416 and Chris Pecora hits .406 for the Battling Bishops, who split a doubleheader with UW-Whitewater earlier this season.

**Wheaton** is the only top seed to survive the regionals and the only team to go undefeated through the round. The Lyons had a 24-game winning streak before losing to Eastern Connecticut State earlier this year. Scott Guillerault has 13 home runs and 54 RBI's.

## Series History

The only two teams in this year's field that the Pointers have ever faced are Wheaton and Aurora.

UW-Stevens Point played Wheaton earlier this year on March 19, losing 3-2 in Port Charlotte, Fla. Jordan Zimmermann took the loss for the Pointers, allowing one earned run with nine strikeouts.

The Pointers are 2-2 all-time against Aurora and last played the Spartans on March 22, 2001, sweeping a doubleheader in Fort Myers, Fla. by scores of 7-4 and 8-4.

## Program Notes:

\* - UW-Stevens Point made its only previous World Series appearance in 1997 in Salem, Va. The Pointers beat Bridgewater State (Mass.) 9-3 and then lost to Carthage 12-1 and Wooster (Ohio) 11-7.

\* - The Pointers last played at Fox Cities Stadium in the 1997 Midwest Regional and experienced one of their most memorable days in school history. UW-Stevens Point rallied through the loser's bracket of a four-team regional and swept UW-Oshkosh 10-6 and 6-5 on the final day for its only previous World Series berth.

\* - UW-Stevens Point is making its eighth NCAA Division III tournament appearance, including its seventh in the past 10 years, and is 18-16 all-time in the postseason. The Pointers lost in the regional finals two of the past four years with losses to UW-Whitewater in 2005 and Lakeland in 2002.

\* - UW-Stevens Point's 34 wins are the third-highest total in school history. The Pointers were 38-11 in 2005 and 37-10 in 2002. This season marks the sixth 30-win season in school history. All of the 30-win campaigns have been since 1997.

\* - Entering the 2006 season, UW-Stevens Point ranks 20th among all NCAA Division III schools in total victories since 2000. The Pointers entered this season with a 184-76-1 record over the past six seasons.

\* - The Pointers' WIAC tournament title was their fifth since 1999. They also won titles in 1999, 2001, 2002 and 2005 and have been among the top three finishers in all 10 WIAC tournaments.

\* - Prior to 1997, UW-Stevens Point had six winning records in the previous 20 seasons. The Pointers had won more than 20 games just once, coming in 1988 when they went 27-8 and reached the NCAA Division III tournament.

\* - UW-Stevens Point has won nine national titles in five different sports. The only other time a Pointer team played for a national crown in the state of Wisconsin came in 1990 when the men's hockey team beat Plattsburgh State (N.Y.) in Stevens Point.

## Team Notes:

- \* - After winning five straight games in the regional, the Pointers are now 9-0 when facing elimination this season. They also won four straight games after losing their opening game in the WIAC tournament.
- \* - UW-Stevens Point leads the country in home runs for the second straight year with 71 round-trippers for an average of 1.42 per game. The Pointers hit 16 home runs in last week's regional tournament. They are 28-4 in games they hit a home run. The Pointers hit 93 homers last year, marking the fifth-highest total in NCAA Division III history.
- \* - The Pointers lead the WIAC in batting, pitching and fielding with a .328 batting average, 3.24 ERA and .961 fielding percentage.
- \* - UW-Stevens Point has scored 10 or more runs 21 times this season and allowed its opponents to reach double figures just twice with both coming in Florida. The Pointers have won 51 straight games when scoring in double figures. They average 8.2 runs per game and have outscored opponents 410-199 this year.
- \* - The Pointers' top eight pitchers all have ERA's of 3.55 or lower. They have held opponents to a .250 batting average and posted a school record 374 strikeouts for an average of 7.5 per game.
- \* - In last week's regional, UW-Stevens Point had nine different pitchers combine for a 2.55 ERA and 66 strikeouts with 14 walks in 53 innings pitched.
- \* - UW-Stevens Point has six shutouts this season. The other six teams in the WIAC combined had a total of eight shutouts this year.
- \* - The Pointers are 2-9 in one-run games this year and suffered both of their postseason defeats by one run. They went 4-5 on their Florida trip with four one-run defeats. Their largest margin of defeat among their 16 losses was a 5-0 setback to UW-Whitewater on April 22.
- \* - The Pointers' 72 stolen bases are the second-most in school history and four short of the school record set in 1990. UW-Stevens Point has been caught just 15 times and is 37-for-40 on steals during the month of May.
- \* - The Pointers' opponents have 19 stolen bases while having been caught 21 times this season. Opponents attempted just one steal in last week's regional and are just six-for-20 in steal attempts over the last 35 games.
- \* - The team's current five-game winning streak is one short of its longest win streak this year when it swept Lakeland, St. Norbert and UW-Stout from April 12-19.
- \* - After returning home from Florida in late March, the Pointers have played all 41 games in the state of Wisconsin. Their furthest trip was a 153-mile trip to UW-Stout. The regional in Wisconsin Rapids was 23 miles from campus and this week's World Series is 70 miles away.
- \* - Friday's game will be the Pointers' fourth night game of the year. They won all three previous games under the lights, outscoring opponents 41-10.
- \* - The two wins over Ripon last week gave the Red Hawks four losses in their last 34 games with all four coming to UW-Stevens Point. The Pointers won a regular season doubleheader at Ripon on April 25.
- \* - The Pointers played a school record 50 games this season, covering a span of 64 days from March 18-May 20.

## Probable Batting Order

- 1 - Senior shortstop **Jake Frombach** (Stratford, WI) has led off and played shortstop for every game the past two seasons. He has had hits in 44 of the team's 50 games and tied the WIAC single-season record with 85 hits this year, including 73 singles. Frombach ranks third in WIAC history with 240 career hits, including 198 singles. He also holds school records with 168 games played, 166 starts and 658 at bats. He ranks third in school history with 153 runs scored.
  - 2 - Senior second baseman **Nat Richter** (Green Bay, WI) missed 14 starts after being hit by a line drive in the face in batting practice prior to the Pointers' game with Lakeland on April 12. He has hits in all but two of the 18 games since and is hitting .373 with 24 RBI's over that span. Richter set a single-game school record with a six-for-six performance against Augustana (Ill.) on March 19.
  - 3 - Junior leftfielder **Ryan Byrnes** (Beaver Dam, WI) was hitting just .200 with three RBI's on April 7. He joined the regular lineup on April 12 and has since started 31 straight games and now leads the team with a .394 average and 49 RBI's. He hit a grand slam to spark the Pointers' regional win over Coe.
  - 4 - Junior catcher **Doug Coe** (Appleton, WI) ranked 10th in the nation in batting last year with a .451 average at Lawrence. He was named to the all-regional team after hitting three home runs in the tournament. A North High graduate, Coe worked on the media staff at the World Series the past two years and is the third player from an Appleton high school to play in the World Series at Fox Cities Stadium, joining UW-Oshkosh's Eric Holdorf (North H.S.) in 2003 and Carthage's Eric Krull (North H.S.), who played in 2002.
  - 5 - Junior first baseman **Adam Evanoff** (Plover, WI) has started all but one of the 41 games since the team returned from Florida. He has hits in 23 of his last 27 games and is hitting .600 with runners in scoring position during the postseason. He hit two home runs in the regional tournament, including a solo homer in the title game.
  - 6 - Senior centerfielder **Chuck Brehm** (Spencer, WI) was named the WIAC Player of the Year and hit the game-winning home run in the regional title game. Brehm ranks second in school history with 35 homers and 50 stolen bases despite playing just three seasons after being cut in 2002 and redshirting in 2003. He joins UW-Oshkosh's Kevin Reichardt as the only players in WIAC history to reach those career marks. Brehm has a single-season school record 26 steals this year and his 15 home runs ranks third in a single season. Brehm is the only baseball Academic All-American in school history, earning third-team honors last season.
  - 7 - Sophomore third baseman/DH **Tim Schlosser** (Oconomowoc, WI) has hits in eight of the team's 11 postseason games. Schlosser is seven-for-11 with the bases loaded this year. He is hitting .438 in the eighth spot in the batting order and .250 in the other spots.
  - 8 - Sophomore designated hitter/pitcher **Jordan Zimmermann** (Auburndale, WI) led the team in hitting at the regional with a .400 average (six-for-15). He also hit a pair of home runs and drove in four runs. Zimmermann has struck out just 11 times in 100 at bats.
  - 9 - Sophomore rightfielder **Brandon Scheidler** (Chippewa Falls, WI) has hit four of his five home runs this year during the postseason. His two-run homer in the seventh inning of the regional title game tied the game at 4-4. He had a double and three homers for his only four hits of the regional, but he had four walks and three hit by pitches for a .458 on base percentage.
- \* - Sophomore third baseman/DH **Stewart Larsen** (Sturgeon Bay, WI) has just two fielding errors in 103 chances and has 47 straight perfect chances since his last error on April 21.

### Starting Pitchers:

\* - Sophomore **Jordan Zimmermann** (Auburndale, WI) was the WIAC Pitcher of the Year and was named the regional MVP after posting 28 strikeouts in 17 innings in the regional. He has allowed opponents to hit just .176. In his four losses, the Pointers have scored a total of six runs and lost three one-run games. He already ranks sixth in school history with 135 career strikeouts. Zimmermann will play for the Eau Claire Express of the Northwoods League this summer.

\* - Senior **Josh Perkins** (Two Rivers, WI) missed the last two seasons while serving in Iraq and ranks second in the WIAC behind Zimmermann with 78 strikeouts. The 26-year old was married this past summer and changed his last name from Blaha. He earned first-team all-WIAC honors and had 11 scoreless innings in the WIAC tournament. Also a first-team all-WIAC pitcher in 2003, he was the winning pitcher in the 2001 and 2002 WIAC finals and ranks sixth in school history with 18 career victories.

\* - Sophomore **Travis Kempf** (Kewaskum, WI) was named to the all-regional team after pitching his first career nine-inning complete game while allowing no earned runs against St. Thomas. Kempf pitched last year at Illinois-Chicago and stands six-foot-seven. He will pitch for the Eau Claire Express of the Northwoods League this summer for the second straight year.

\* - Junior **Ryan Hopkins** (Libertyville, IL) ranks third in the WIAC with a 2.96 ERA and fourth with 46 strikeouts. A transfer from Illinois-Chicago, Hopkins made an appearance in an NCAA Division I regional game last year against North Carolina State.

\* - Sophomore **Mike Thrun** (Franklin, WI) was the winning pitcher in the WIAC title game, allowing two runs and four hits over six innings against UW-Whitewater. He is 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA over his last four starts, which includes two starts against regional runner-up Ripon.

### Bullpen:

\* - Sophomore **Brandon Hemstead** (DeForest, WI) has allowed one earned run over eight innings in the postseason. He earned the victory with four and one-third innings of relief against St. Olaf in the regional. Hemstead was not on the team's postseason roster in 2005.

\* - Freshman **Jeff Zielke** (Watertown, WI) earned the win in the first win over Ripon Saturday with seven strikeouts in three and two-thirds innings. Zielke has allowed one of 13 inherited runners to score this year and leads the team with four saves. A first-team all-state prep pitcher last year, he was the MVP of last summer's state Class AAA state American Legion tournament. He also earned a win at the national Legion regional.

\* - Freshman **Tyler Lorenz** (Pembine, WI) recorded the final two outs in the first win over UW-Whitewater in the WIAC finals. He had strong starts to earn regular season wins over St. Norbert and Ripon. Lorenz's high school has an enrollment of 78 students.

\* - Freshman **Garret Nix** (Osseo, WI) struck out the side in the ninth inning of the Pointers' regional win over Coe last week. He allowed just two runs over six innings in a win over Millikin earlier this season.

\* - Sophomore **Jeff Sadlemyer** (Plover, WI) allowed no earned runs over two innings to help preserve last week's regional win over Coe. It was his second appearance since March 20.

### Strikeout Oddity:

One of the strangest facts of the Pointers' season is that the school's single-game strikeout record went untouched for 45 years and has now been set or tied four times this season, including three times in the last 16 games.

Prior to this season, the single-game record was 14 strikeouts by Bill Kuse in 1961 against UW-Milwaukee. Jordan Zimmermann tied the mark on April 1 against UW-Platteville before Mike Thrun struck out 15 against Marian on May 2. Then on May 13, Josh Perkins struck out 15 against UW-Oshkosh in the WIAC tournament. Perhaps fittingly, the final out the Pointers recorded to reach the World Series came when Zimmermann struck out the final Ripon batter for his 15th strikeout on May 20 in the regional title game.

### Reserve Position Players:

\* - Sophomore outfielder **Joel Hojnacki** (Plover, WI) made 30 starts this season and hit his first home run of the year in his only plate appearance of the regional. Hojnacki played football for the Pointers in the fall of 2003, ranking second in school history with 28 punt returns in a season.

\* - Sophomore catcher **Ben Warwick** (Green Bay, WI) made 21 starts this year and is three-for-seven in the postseason. He threw out eight consecutive base stealers from April 8-22 and has allowed just three steals since.

\* - Sophomore first baseman **Brian Stoneberg** (Hastings, MN) made five starts this season. He had four of his five RBI's and a home run in his first career start on April 2 against UW-Platteville.

\* - Freshman outfielder **Kyle Cummings** (Prentice, WI) has appeared as a pinch runner 11 times this season. He has one stolen base and three runs scored.

\* - Freshman catcher **Garett Bloom** (Tomah, WI) has caught a total of four innings this season. He is the team's primary bullpen catcher and the brother of Pointers' head coach Pat Bloom.
