#### Pointers This Week:

A rematch of last year's dramatic Elite Eight showdown is set for Saturday as UW-Stevens Point hosts Lawrence in a second round game. The Vikings advanced with a 70-56 win at Gustavus Adolphus in Thursday's first round, while defending national champion UW-Stevens Point received a first round bye. The Pointers won last year's game 82-81 in overtime in Tacoma, Wash.

#### Head Coach Jack Bennett:

Jack Bennett carries a 195-56 record in his ninth season with the Pointers and became the school's all-time winningest coach with a 75-52 win over UW-Stout on Dec. 11. He passed Hale Quandt, who posted a 178-126 record in 15 seasons from 1947-62.

### Pointer Update:

UW-Stevens Point posted three victories last week to claim its second consecutive WIAC tournament title and earn its third straight trip to the NCAA Division III tournament.

UW-Stevens Point earned a spot in the field after beating UW-Whitewater 87-77 in the title game on Saturday at home. Jason Kalsow had 28 points and Nick Bennett added 16 points as the Pointers used a 10-1 run in the second half to pull away from a 47-43 halftime lead for the win.

### Tournament Notes:

\* - UW-Stevens Point is 11-3 all-time in NCAA tournament games, winning the national title last year and reaching the Elite Eight in 1997 and 2000. The Pointers' three losses have all been to the eventual national runner-up, coming to Nebraska Wesleyan in 1997, UW-Eau Claire in 2000 and Gustavus Adolphus in 2003.

\* - WIAC teams are 77-26 all-time in NCAA tournament play with eight of the losses coming to other WIAC teams. Of the 26 qualifiers since 1988, 18 have reached the Sweet 16.

\* - Only four times since 1988 has a WIAC team been knocked out of the tournament in the first two rounds by a non-conference foe and three of those have been to Gustavus Adolphus. The Gusties beat UW-Stevens Point in the 2003 second round, UW-Whitewater in the 1997 first round and UW-Oshkosh in the 1996 second round. The other early setback was the University of Chicago over UW-Eau Claire in the 2001 second round.

\* - UW-Stevens Point is attempting to become the third team to win back-to-back national titles. UW-Platteville won in 1998 and 1999 and North Park won three straight from 1978-80.

\* - The last national champion to drop its opening game in the tournament the following year was UW-Platteville, which lost to UW-Whitewater in the 1996 first round after winning the 1995 crown.

### Team Notes:

\* - UW-Stevens Point is now 3-0 in WIAC tournament championship games, beating UW-Eau Claire in 2000, UW-Platteville in 2004 and UW-Whitewater last weekend.

\* - UW-Stevens Point's 24 victories mark the third straight year and eighth time in school history the Pointers have reached that mark. All of the 20-win seasons have been since 1983-84.

\* - The Pointers allowed a season-high 77 points to UW-Whitewater last week and fell to second nationally in scoring defense at 56.4 points per game behind Wittenberg (Ohio) at 54.9 points. It is the first time all season the Pointers have not led the country. The Pointers rank eighth in field goal percentage defense at 37.4 percent.

\* - The Pointers' 47-43 halftime lead last week was the highest-scoring first half they've played since Jan. 9, 2002 when they held a 48-44 lead at UW-River Falls in an eventual 94-79 victory.

\* - UW-Stevens Point is one of the top shooting teams in the country, ranking sixth in three-point percentage (42.2), 12th in field goal percentage (50.4) and 16th in free throw percentage (74.9).

\* - The Pointers shot 55.9 percent from the field in the three WIAC tournament games last week, which is remarkably similar to their performance in last year's postseason when they shot 55.7 percent over their nine victories.

\* - UW-Stevens Point is 51-1 in its last 52 games against non-WIAC opponents since a loss to Edgewood on Dec. 29, 1999. The only loss during the span was a 75-62 loss to Gustavus Adolphus in the 2003 NCAA second round. The Pointers have won 45 straight regular season non-conference games.

### Scouting the Opponent

Lawrence rolled through its tournament opener 70-56 at Gustavus Adolphus on Thursday as the Vikings closed the first half with an 8-0 run to take a 34-22 halftime advantage. Chris Braier had 20 points and 14 rebounds to lead the way, while Kyle MacGillis came off the bench to score 14 points.

The Vikings survived Ripon 82-77 in overtime in last week's Midwest Conference championship game to qualify for the NCAA tournament. They are making their third trip to the tournament, having also appeared in the 1997 event when they lost at Wabash. Last year, they won three games before losing to UW-Stevens Point in the sectional final.

Lawrence has impressive wins at both UW-Platteville and UW-Oshkosh this season. Chris Braier leads the team with 15.4 points per game and 11.6 rebounds per game. His rebounding average ranks 12th nationally. Jason Hollinbeck, Dan Evans and MacGillis also average in double figures.

Lawrence guard Keven Bradley was a member of the Pointers' national championship team last season.

### Series History

UW-Stevens Point leads the all-time series with Lawrence 23-11 in the oldest rivalry in school history. The Pointers played Lawrence in their first two games as a varsity program, losing 19-14 and 17-14 in 1897.

UW-Stevens Point has won 12 straight meetings since Lawrence's last win in 1953-54. The Pointers won last year's sectional meeting 82-81 in overtime in Tacoma, Wash. The teams' last regular season meeting was in 2000 with the Pointers winning 83-70.

#### **#10 Tamaris Relerford, 5-8, Sr., Guard, Beloit, Wis.**

- \* - Started 26 of team's 27 games and played in every game.
- \* - Has played in all 116 games of career and needs one more to tie school record of 117 games held by Tim Naegeli and Terry Porter.
- \* - Has been red-hot from the field over the past eight games, shooting 55.6 percent (15-for-27) from three-point range over the span after shooting 38.0 percent over first 19 games. Also shooting 54.1 percent overall from the field over the stretch after shooting 34.4 percent in the first 19 games.
- \* - Made 34 of his 41 field goals this season from three-point range. Four of his seven two-point shots have come in the last four games.
- \* - Had a career-high 16 points in win over UW-River Falls on Feb. 16, making five of six three-pointers.
- \* - Scored 12 points in WIAC title game win over UW-Whitewater, including a three-pointer for 59-56 lead with 12:13 left that gave the team the lead for good.

#### **#12 Shawn Lee, 5-10, Fr., Guard, Marshfield, Wis.**

- \* - Missed the past eight games with a broken hand, but returned to practice this week.
- \* - Had a season-high seven points in back-to-back wins over UW-Stout and Viterbo.

#### **#20 Brett Hirsch, 6-1, Soph., Guard, Menomonee Falls, Wis.**

- \* - Has played in 18 games and scored points in 13 of his appearances, including five straight games. Season-high is five points against Wisconsin Lutheran.

- \* - Started first 12 games last season, averaging 18.9 minutes per game over first 14 games.
- \* - Scored career-high 12 points in first career game vs. Northland.

#### **#22 Brad Kalsow, 6-4, Fr., Guard, Huntley, Ill.**

- \* - Played in 24 of team's 27 games, but did not appear in WIAC semifinals or finals.
- \* - Scored season-high 12 points while making all four three-point shot attempts in win over Viterbo.
- \* - Netted seven points in first two minutes of career, entering game in first half of season-opener against Southwestern.
- \* - Brother of Pointer forward Jason Kalsow. Scored Huntley high school record 1,819 career points, surpassing Jason's mark.

#### **#24 Steve Hicklin, 6-4, Fr., Guard, Sussex, Wis.**

- \* - Has appeared in 21 games this season and seen increased time over last eight games as backup point guard due to injury to Lee. Has scored 18 points over the past eight games.
- \* - Had two three-pointers in home win against UW-Eau Claire for season-high six points. Also scored six points in regular season home win over UW-Superior.
- \* - Redshirted last season.

#### **#25 Kyle Grusczyński, 6-6, Sr., Guard, Seymour, Wis.**

- \* - Has played in every game this year, making starts at home against UW-Stout and Wisconsin Lutheran in place of Maus and at UW-La Crosse in place of Relerford.
- \* - Had season-high 14 points in start against UW-Stout, hitting four of five three-pointers. Career-high is 19 points as a sophomore at UW-Platteville.
- \* - Had a career-high seven rebounds in WIAC title game win over UW-Whitewater and played a career-high 28 minutes for the third time this season.
- \* - Scored 10 points in 22 minutes of win at Gustavus Adolphus last year. Had eight points in NCAA first round win over Benedictine.
- \* - Played freshman season at University of Wisconsin-Madison, appearing in six games for the Badgers.

#### **#32 Cory Krautkramer, 6-5, Soph., Forward, Cameron, Wis.**

- \* - Played in 17 games as a backup forward, scoring season-high three points at home against UW-Stout.
- \* - Notched career-high five points in win over Calumet.

#### **#33 Nick Bennett, 6-5, Sr., Forward, Stevens Point, Wis.**

- \* - Ranks seventh in school history with 1,539 points and needs 14 points to move into fifth place.
- \* - School's all-time leader with 212 career three-pointers.
- \* - Earned second straight first-team All-WIAC honor, while ranking fourth in league in scoring at 17.7 points per game.
- \* - Ranks second in WIAC and fifth in nation in free throw shooting at 90.3 percent. Made 24 straight attempts twice this season. Has made 87.4 percent of career free throw attempts.
- \* - Set single-season school record with 83 three-pointers last year and has 68 this year.
- \* - Has scored double figures in 26 of team's 27 games this year and team is 40-2 over past two years when he scores 14 points or more. Only game under double figures was nine points at home against UW-Platteville.
- \* - Had season-high 31 points in win over UW-Whitewater on Feb. 9. Scored 28 points in WIAC semifinal win over UW-Oshkosh. Had 27 points and seven three-pointers in exhibition loss at Marquette.
- \* - Second-team preseason All-American by Street & Smith's.
- \* - MVP of 2004 NCAA final four, scoring 30 points in national championship game against Williams.
- \* - Averaged 25.5 points in 2004 NCAA tournament after posting career-high 37 points against Puget Sound, 30 against Williams, 25 against Lawrence, 24 against Benedictine, 20 against John Carroll and 17 against Gustavus Adolphus. Also led team with 18 points in 2003 NCAA tournament game against Gustavus Adolphus.
- \* - Made 21 of 35 three-point shot attempts during 2004 NCAA tournament for 60.0 percent rate.

#### **#34 Jon Krull, 6-4, Soph., Guard, Marshall, Wis.**

- \* - Has started all 27 games this season and started 13 of last 14 games as a freshman. Team is 37-3 with him in the starting lineup.
- \* - Made 22 of last 23 free throws over the last seven games. Had made 65.0 percent of free throws (26-for-40) before the stretch.
- \* - Scored a total of 36 points in three WIAC tournament games, including season-high 20 in quarterfinal win over UW-Superior.
- \* - Has a steal in eight straight games and 34 of 40 games as a starter.
- \* - Notched career-highs 25 points and eight rebounds in 2004 NCAA semifinal victory over John Carroll.
- \* - Scored 2,094 career points in high school, including 36 in 2002 Division 2 state championship game.

#### **#40 Matt Bouche, 6-6, Jr., Forward, Dane, Wis.**

- \* - Appeared in 16 games as a reserve forward, scoring season-high four points in win over Edgewood.
- \* - Totaled career-high numbers with eight points and seven rebounds last season in win over Marian.

#### **#42 Brian Bauer, 6-5, Jr., Forward, Auburndale, Wis.**

- \* - Played in 26 of team's 27 games and made one start at UW-River Falls. Had season-high 10 points while hitting all five field goal attempts in win over Edgewood.
- \* - Made nine straight field goals at one span during mid-season.
- \* - Season-high 17 minutes played came in losses at UW-Platteville and UW-Oshkosh.
- \* - Had career-high 15 points in key late season win over UW-Whitewater in 2002-03 season in first career start.

#### **#44 Jason Kalsow, 6-7, Sr., Forward, Huntley, Ill.**

- \* - School's all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 1,785 points and 840 rebounds. Holds school record with 703 field goals made.
- \* - Also has 437 assists to rank fourth in school history and needs five to move into third place. Only player in WIAC history with at least 1,700 points and 400 assists. Also the only player in league history to record 400 assists and 800 rebounds.
- \* - 2004-05 WIAC Player of the Year, becoming fifth player in school history to earn the award. One of 10 finalists for Josten's National Player of the Year award.

### Jason Kalsow, cont.

\* - Has started all 116 games of four-year career and needs one more game to match school record held by Tim Naegeli and Terry Porter.

\* - Fourth player in school history to earn All-WIAC honors three straight years.

\* - Leads WIAC in points at 19.9 per game, assists at 4.2 per game and three-point field goal shooting at 50.0 percent. Ranks third in rebounding at 7.2 per game and is among top 14 in all 12 of league's statistical categories.

\* - Has scored in double figures in 61 straight games and totaled only career 30-point game with 31 points in win over UW-Eau Claire on Feb. 5.

\* - Named second-team All-American by NABC in 2003-04.

Preseason first-team All-American this year by Street & Smith's.

\* - Made game-winning shot with 0.2 seconds left in national championship game against Williams, finishing with 24 points, nine rebounds and six assists.

\* - Had career-high 16 rebounds along with 15 points in NCAA semi-final win over John Carroll.

\* - Has had three double-doubles this season, including 28 points and 10 rebounds in WIAC tournament title game against UW-Whitewater. Has 21 career double-doubles and 12 other games with nine rebounds that fell one short of a double-double.

\* - Had career-high 11 assists in 2002-03 at UW-Platteville.

\* - Made nine career three-pointers over first two seasons, made 23 three-pointers last year and 37 this season.

### #45 Mike Prey, 6-6, Jr., Forward, Shawano, Wis.

\* - Has played in 23 of team's 27 games, scoring a season-best four points against Viterbo.

\* - Made six of seven field goal attempts during 2004 NCAA tournament, scoring career-high six points in win over Puget Sounds.

\* - Played a career-high 14 minutes in 2004 NCAA tournament opener against Benedictine.

### #50 Eric Maus, 6-9, Sr., Center, Green Bay, Wis.

\* - Has played in 25 games and made 23 starts this year, missing two games and two starts after suffering an ankle injury in the final minute of the first half at UW-Eau Claire on Dec. 4.

\* - Named honorable mention All-WIAC for first career all-conference mention.

\* - Has averaged 10.2 points over the last five games after averaging 5.9 points over the first 20 games of the year. Scored season-high 14 points in WIAC quarterfinal win over UW-Superior.

\* - Had career-high 11 rebounds in wins at home against UW-La Crosse and at UW-Stout this season.

\* - Leads WIAC in assist-turnover ratio at 3.38 with 54 assists and 16 turnovers. No other player in WIAC has higher than a 2.24 ratio.

\* - Has made 13 straight free throws over the past five games.

\* - Started all 32 games last season after appearing in all 55 games during the previous two years as a reserve.

\* - Hit game-winning basket with five seconds remaining in overtime in 82-81 sectional final win over Lawrence.

\* - Assisted Jason Kalsow's game-winning shot in national title game.

\* - Totaled career-high 18 points last season at UW-Whitewater.

\* - Only career double-double came with 14 points and 10 rebounds in victory at UW-Oshkosh last season.

### #52 Gbenga Awe, 6-5, Fr., Forward, Milwaukee, Wis.

\* - Attended UW-Milwaukee last year and did not play basketball. Was not recruited to UW-Stevens Point and made team through open tryout.

\* - Joined regular rotation on Dec. 4 at UW-Eau Claire, starting second half after Maus was injured. Has played in 23 games this season, including four minutes in WIAC tournament title game.

\* - Had season-high six points in 16 minutes played at UW-River Falls. Grabbed seven rebounds in win over Wisconsin Lutheran.
