#### Pointers This Week:

UW-Stevens Point hosts an NCAA Division III sectional tournament for the first time ever and faces the same semifinal opponent as last year when it takes on Puget Sound in the opening game. Trinity and Hanover meet in the other semifinal with the winner of Saturday's title game advancing to the final four in Salem, Va.

#### Head Coach Jack Bennett:

Jack Bennett carries a 196-56 record in his ninth season with the Pointers and became the school's all-time winningest coach with a 75-52 win over UW-Stout on Dec. 11. His .778 winning percentage ranks second among all active Division III coaches behind Brian VanHaaften of Buena Vista, who has a .794 percentage.

## Pointer Update:

The Pointers dismantled Lawrence 79-45 in front of a sell-out crowd in their opening game of the tournament to reach the sectional for the fourth time in nine years. Nick Bennett scored 16 of the Pointers' first 25 points as UW-Stevens Point built a 36-26 halftime lead and then used an early 17-0 run in the second half to take a commanding lead.

Bennett finished nine-for-13 from the floor and had 23 points, while Jason Kalsow had 15 points, eight rebounds and five assists. Jon Krull totaled 13 points as the Pointers shot 58.3 percent in the second half while outscoring the Vikings 43-19 after halftime.

## Scouting the Opponents

Puget Sound is one of the nation's top offensive teams, ranking sixth in the country at 94.9 points per game. The Loggers attempt nearly 26 three-pointers per game and bring a 12-game winning streak into the weekend after winning a dramatic second round game over Buena Vista (Iowa) 85-82.

Jeremy Cross, the team's leading scorer at 16.6 points per game, sank a three-pointer with seven seconds left as the Loggers completed a comeback from a 10-point deficit in the final 12 minutes for the win. Cross is one of four returning starters from last year's team and one of four players averaging double figures. Zack McVey scores 15.1 points per game and Chase Curtiss averages 14.6 points.

Hanover knocked off the Midwest Region's top team, Illinois Wesleyan, for the second time this season to advance to the sectional. The Panthers won 83-76 and were led by Tommy Dennis and Bryan Chrin at 18 points apiece. Ben Lye leads the team for the season at 12.4 points per game.

The Panthers rank ninth in the country in defense at 59.7 points per game. Hanover's only previous sectional appearance was 2003 when it lost to Gustavus Adolphus. The Panthers lost earlier this year 74-62 to Ripon, which the Pointers defeated 75-53.

Trinity is making its first sectional appearance and beat Pomona-Pitzer 65-53 in the second round. The Tigers jumped out to a 36-15 halftime lead and got 20 points from Peter Murray in the win. Sean Devins leads the team with 12.9 points per game and ranks fifth in the country with 90 blocks. Murray averages 12.1 points per game.

The Tigers rank seventh in the country in defense at 59.3 points per game and fifth in field goal percentage defense at 37.1 percent. Trinity split with conference foe Southwestern, which the Pointers beat 65-42 in the season opener.

## Series History

UW-Stevens Point defeated Puget Sound 100-79 in last year's sectional semifinal in the only previous meeting between the teams. Nick Bennett had 37 points and the Pointers built a 50-30 halftime lead while shooting 70.0 percent in the first half and 64.3 percent for the game.

The Pointers have never played Hanover in school history. The only Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference team the Pointers have played is Anderson, meeting four times with the most recent in the 1974 Sentry Classic.

UW-Stevens Point and Trinity have never met. The only Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference foe the Pointers have played came earlier this year against Southwestern.

## Tournament Notes:

\* - UW-Stevens Point is 12-3 all-time in NCAA tournament games, winning the national title last year and reaching the Elite Eight in 1997 and 2000. The Pointers' three losses have all been to the eventual national runner-up, coming to Nebraska Wesleyan in 1997, UW-Eau Claire in 2000 and Gustavus Adolphus in 2003.

\* - All three of the Pointers' sectional final games have been decided by three-point shot attempts at the buzzer by the opponent.

Nebraska Wesleyan in 1997 and UW-Eau Claire in 2000 both made threes at the horn to go to the final four, while Lawrence missed a three-point shot at the buzzer in overtime last year.

\* - WIAC teams are 78-26 all-time in NCAA tournament play with eight of the losses coming to other WIAC teams. Including this year's Pointers, of the 26 qualifiers since 1988, 19 have reached the Sweet 16.

\* - The WIAC has had 10 teams reach the final four since 1983 and the conference has won seven national championships. UW-Platteville won national titles in 1991, 1995, 1998 and 1999 while finishing third in 1992. UW-Whitewater won titles in 1984 and 1989 after a fourth place finish in 1983. UW-Eau Claire was runner-up in 2000 and the Pointers won last year's championship.

\* - UW-Stevens Point is attempting to become the third team to win back-to-back national titles. UW-Platteville won in 1998 and 1999 and North Park won three straight from 1978-80.

## Team Notes:

\* - UW-Stevens Point's 25 victories mark the second straight year and seventh time in school history the Pointers have reached that mark. All of the 25-win seasons have been since 1982-83.

\* - UW-Stevens Point is 52-1 in its last 53 games against non-WIAC opponents since a loss to Edgewood on Dec. 29, 1999. The only loss during the span was a 75-62 loss to Gustavus Adolphus in the 2003 NCAA second round. The Pointers have won 45 straight regular season non-conference games.

\* - The Pointers have been the nation's top-ranked team four different times this year. They were No. 1 in the preseason poll and dropped out after each of the three losses only to regain the top spot each time. UW-Stevens Point has been No. 1 in 11 of 15 polls this year and has been in the top 25 for 61 straight weeks.

\* - UW-Stevens Point's six seniors have accounted for 72.8 percent of the team's scoring this year. In fact, Jason Kalsow and Nick Bennett alone have scored 51.5 percent of the team's points.

\* - Over their last seven NCAA tournament games, the Pointers are shooting 56.1 percent from the field, 46.5 percent from three-point range and 79.6 percent at the line. They shot just 38.6 percent in a loss to Gustavus Adolphus in 2003, but have connected on at least 51.6 percent of their shots in every game since.

\* - The Pointers are shooting 55.4 percent from the field in their four postseason victories this year, which is remarkably similar to their performance in last year's postseason when they shot 55.7 percent over their nine victories.

\* - The Pointers are 16-0 at home this year and have a 20-game home winning streak. The total matches the school record for home wins, coming in 1983-84 when they were 16-1 and 1984-85 when they were 16-0. Current Milwaukee Bucks coach Terry Porter and St. Louis University coach Brad Soderberg played for those teams. The longest home win streak in school history is 25 games.

\* - UW-Stevens Point has outscored team by an average of 22.6 points per game at home this year. The Pointers shoot 53.5 percent from the field at home while holding opponents to 35.8 percent.

### **#10 Tamaris Relerford, 5-8, Sr., Guard, Beloit, Wis.**

- \* - Started 27 of team's 28 games and played in every game.
- \* - Missed second half of NCAA second round victory over Lawrence and is out for the season with a hand injury.
- \* - Tied school record of 117 career games played held by Tim Naegeli and Terry Porter. Kalsow has also played in 117 games.
- \* - Was red-hot from the field over the past nine games, shooting 50.0 percent (15-for-30) from three-point range over the span after shooting 38.0 percent over first 19 games. Shot 50.0 percent (20-for-40) overall from the field over the stretch after shooting 34.4 percent in the first 19 games.
- \* - Had a career-high 16 points in win over UW-River Falls on Feb. 16, making five of six three-pointers.
- \* - Made 34 of his 41 field goals this season from three-point range. Four of his seven two-point shots have come in the last five games.

### **#10 Tyler Doyle, 6-2, Fr., Guard, Appleton, Wis.**

- \* - Dressed for seven of the last nine games in place of Lee and played in three games, scoring two points against UW-Eau Claire.

### **#12 Shawn Lee, 5-10, Fr., Guard, Marshfield, Wis.**

- \* - Missed the past eight games with a broken hand, but returned to action with five points in four minutes against Lawrence last week.
- \* - Had a season-high seven points in back-to-back wins over UW-Stout and Viterbo.

### **#20 Brett Hirsch, 6-1, Soph., Guard, Menomonee Falls, Wis.**

- \* - Has played in 19 games and scored points in six straight appearances. Season-high is five points against Wisconsin Lutheran.
- \* - Started first 12 games last season, averaging 18.9 minutes per game over first 14 games.
- \* - Scored career-high 12 points in first career game vs. Northland.

### **#22 Brad Kalsow, 6-4, Fr., Guard, Huntley, Ill.**

- \* - Played in 25 of team's 28 games, but did not appear in WIAC semifinals or finals.
- \* - Scored season-high 12 points while making all four three-point shot attempts in win over Viterbo.
- \* - Brother of Pointer forward Jason Kalsow. Scored Huntley high school record 1,819 career points, surpassing Jason's mark.

### **#24 Steve Hicklin, 6-4, Fr., Guard, Sussex, Wis.**

- \* - Has appeared in 22 games this season and seen increased time over last nine games as backup point guard due to injury to Lee. Has scored 23 points over the past nine games.
- \* - Played a season-high 17 minutes and had five points while starting the second half in NCAA tournament opener against Lawrence.
- \* - Had two three-pointers in home win against UW-Eau Claire for season-high six points. Also scored six points in regular season home win over UW-Superior.
- \* - Redshirted last season.

### **#25 Kyle Gruszczynski, 6-6, Sr., Guard, Seymour, Wis.**

- \* - Has played in every game this year, making starts at home against UW-Stout and Wisconsin Lutheran in place of Maus and at UW-La Crosse in place of Relerford.
- \* - Had season-high 14 points in start against UW-Stout, hitting four of five three-pointers. Career-high is 19 points as a sophomore at UW-Platteville.
- \* - Had a career-high seven rebounds in WIAC title game win over UW-Whitewater and played a career-high 28 minutes for the third time this season.
- \* - Played freshman season at University of Wisconsin-Madison, appearing in six games for the Badgers.

### **#32 Cory Krautkramer, 6-5, Soph., Forward, Cameron, Wis.**

- \* - Played in 18 games as a backup forward, scoring season-high three points at home against UW-Stout.
- \* - Notched career-high five points in win over Calumet.

### **#33 Nick Bennett, 6-5, Sr., Forward, Stevens Point, Wis.**

- \* - Ranks fifth in school history with 1,562 points. Needs 24 points to move past Terry Porter into fourth place on all-time list.
- \* - School's all-time leader with 216 career three-pointers.
- \* - Scored 23 points in NCAA opener against Lawrence. Averaging 24.3 points while shooting 60.2 percent from the field and 56.9 percent from three-point range in eight career NCAA tournament games. Has averaged 13.8 points over all 113 career games.
- \* - Posted career-high 37 points in 2004 sectional semifinal win over Puget Sound on 13-for-17 shooting.
- \* - Earned second straight first-team All-WIAC honor, while ranking fourth in league in scoring at 17.9 points per game.
- \* - Ranks second in WIAC and fifth in nation in free throw shooting at 90.4 percent. Made 24 straight attempts twice this season. Has made 87.5 percent of career free throw attempts.
- \* - Set single-season school record with 83 three-pointers last year and has 72 this year.

- \* - Has scored double figures in all but one game this year and team is 41-2 over past two years when he scores 14 or more. Only game under 10 points was nine at home against UW-Platteville.

- \* - Had season-high 31 points in win over UW-Whitewater on Feb. 9. Scored 28 points in WIAC semifinal win over UW-Oshkosh. Had 27 points and seven three-pointers in exhibition loss at Marquette.
- \* - MVP of 2004 NCAA final four, scoring 30 points in national championship game against Williams. Made 21 of 35 three-point shot attempts during 2004 NCAA tournament for 60.0 percent rate.

### **#34 Jon Krull, 6-4, Soph., Guard, Marshall, Wis.**

- \* - Has started all 28 games this season and started 13 of last 14 games as a freshman. Team is 38-3 with him in the starting lineup.
- \* - Made 26 of last 27 free throws over the last seven games (96.3 percent). Made 65.0 percent at the line (26-for-40) before the stretch.
- \* - Scored a total of 36 points in three WIAC tournament games, including season-high 20 in quarterfinal win over UW-Superior. Totaled 13 points in NCAA opener against Lawrence.
- \* - Notched career-highs 25 points and eight rebounds in 2004 NCAA semifinal victory over John Carroll.
- \* - Scored 2,094 career points in high school, including 36 in 2002 Division 2 state championship game.

### **#40 Matt Bouche, 6-6, Jr., Forward, Dane, Wis.**

- \* - Appeared in 17 games as a reserve forward, scoring season-high four points in win over Edgewood.
- \* - Totaled career-high numbers with eight points and seven rebounds last season in win over Marian.

### **#42 Brian Bauer, 6-5, Jr., Forward, Auburndale, Wis.**

- \* - Played in 27 of team's 28 games and made one start at UW-River Falls. Had season-high 10 points while hitting all five field goal attempts in win over Edgewood.
- \* - Made nine straight field goals at one span during mid-season.
- \* - Season-high 17 minutes played came in losses at UW-Platteville and UW-Oshkosh.

- \* - Had career-high 15 points in key late season win over UW-Whitewater in 2002-03 season in first career start.

### **#44 Jason Kalsow, 6-7, Sr., Forward, Huntley, Ill.**

- \* - School's all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 1,800 points and 848 rebounds. Holds school record with 708 field goals made.
- \* - Also has 442 assists to rank third in school history. Only player in WIAC history with at least 1,700 points and 400 assists. Also the only player in league history to record 400 assists and 800 rebounds.
- \* - 2004-05 WIAC Player of the Year, becoming fifth player in school history to earn the award. One of 10 finalists for Josten's National Player of the Year award.
- \* - Has started all 117 games of four-year career, matching school record for games played held by Tim Naegeli and Terry Porter.

### Jason Kalsow, cont.

\* - Fourth player in school history to earn All-WIAC honors three straight years.

\* - Leads WIAC in points at 19.7 per game, assists at 4.25 per game and three-point field goal shooting at 50.0 percent. Ranks third in rebounding at 7.3 per game and is among top 14 in all 12 of league's statistical categories.

\* - Has scored in double figures in 62 straight games and totaled only career 30-point game with 31 points in win over UW-Eau Claire on Feb. 5.

\* - Named second-team All-American by NABC in 2003-04.

Preseason first-team All-American this year by Street & Smith's.

\* - Made game-winning shot with 0.2 seconds left in national championship game against Williams, finishing with 24 points, nine rebounds and six assists.

\* - Had career-high 16 rebounds along with 15 points in NCAA semifinal win over John Carroll.

\* - Has had three double-doubles this season, including 28 points and 10 rebounds in WIAC tournament title game against UW-Whitewater. Has 21 career double-doubles and 12 other games with nine rebounds that fell one short of a double-double.

\* - Had career-high 11 assists in 2002-03 at UW-Platteville.

\* - Made 32 three-pointers over first three seasons combined before connecting on 38 shots from behind the arc this season.

### #45 Mike Prey, 6-6, Jr., Forward, Shawano, Wis.

\* - Has played in 24 of team's 28 games, scoring a season-best four points against Viterbo.

\* - Made six of seven field goal attempts during 2004 NCAA tournament, scoring career-high six points in win over Puget Sound.

\* - Played a career-high 14 minutes in 2004 NCAA tournament opener against Benedictine.

### #50 Eric Maus, 6-9, Sr., Center, Green Bay, Wis.

\* - Has played in 26 games and made 24 starts this year, missing two games and two starts after suffering an ankle injury in the final minute of the first half at UW-Eau Claire on Dec. 4.

\* - Named honorable mention All-WIAC for first career all-conference mention.

\* - Has averaged 9.8 points over the last six games after averaging 5.9 points over the first 20 games of the year. Scored season-high 14 points in WIAC quarterfinal win over UW-Superior.

\* - Had career-high 11 rebounds in wins at home against UW-La Crosse and at UW-Stout this season.

\* - Leads WIAC in assist-turnover ratio at 3.24 with 55 assists and 17 turnovers. No other player in WIAC has higher than a 2.29 ratio.

\* - Has made 15 straight free throws over the past five games.

\* - Started all 32 games last season after appearing in all 55 games during the previous two years as a reserve.

\* - Hit game-winning basket with five seconds remaining in overtime in 82-81 sectional final win over Lawrence.

\* - Assisted Jason Kalsow's game-winning shot in national title game.

\* - Totaled career-high 18 points last season at UW-Whitewater.

\* - Only career double-double came with 14 points and 10 rebounds in victory at UW-Oshkosh last season.

### #52 Gbenga Awe, 6-5, Fr., Forward, Milwaukee, Wis.

\* - Attended UW-Milwaukee last year and did not play basketball.

Was not recruited to UW-Stevens Point and made team through open tryout.

\* - Joined regular rotation on Dec. 4 at UW-Eau Claire, starting second half after Maus was injured. Has played in 24 games this season, including four minutes in each of the past two games.

\* - Had season-high six points in 16 minutes played at UW-River Falls. Grabbed seven rebounds in win over Wisconsin Lutheran.
