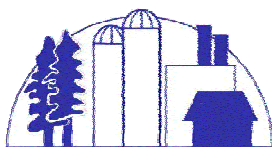

From West: Hwy 8 East to Rhinelander, Right on Golf Course Road before you enter the city.

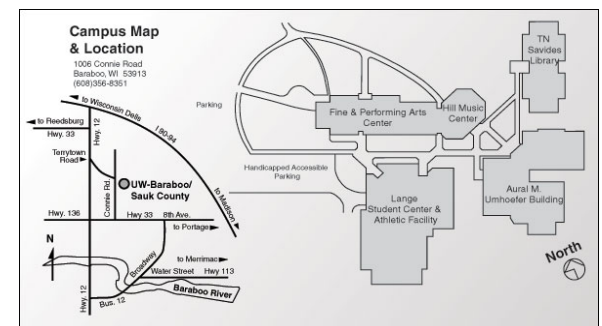
From East: Hwy 32/47 West to Rhinelander, go through the city, Left on Golf Course Road after the airport.
