

Course: EDUC 570 - Aspects of Literacy

Section: 78

Credits: 1 or 3

Description: This course will explore three significant aspects of literacy: using informational texts in the content areas, connecting adolescent readers with excellent literature, and engaging students in creative writing.

Participants will explore these topics by attending workshops sponsored by the Central Wisconsin Reading Council (CWRC) and the Wisconsin Council of Teachers of English Language Arts (WCTELA) and by participating in discussion groups with other educators. (Workshops will be weekday evenings in Sept, Jan, & March.) The focus of the course will be application of these ideas to instructional planning and methods.
